Our handful of **family cruises** are designed to attract families with children so these do offer a somewhat more coordinated routing. For those wishing to learn more about a destination, join one of our **themed cruises** where a travel guide is on board to ensure you get the most from your chosen location. **Distance cruises** appeal to all those who want to sail a little more. Transfers those who want to sail exclusively, also crossing the Atlantic to the Caribbean and back to Europe. Sailing enthusiasts look forward to **regatta** watching Les Voiles de St. Tropez or active participation in the Antigua Classic Yacht Regatta.

Look forward to an individual holiday in a small group in the most beautiful regions of the Mediterranean and the Caribbean seas.


Yacht sailing ... without the pressure of a fixed routing. For our Sailing Yacht Cruises we aim to sail for around six hours a day, with a lunch stop in a tranquil bay so guests have the chance to swim or go ashore. We often sail again after lunch anchoring in another bay for the night. If the conditions as ideal, we may sail into the night under the clear star-filled skies where you can truly take in the vastness of our oceans.

Water sports on board. There are several water sports available on board. You can choose to swim directly from the boat via our admiralty and bathing ladders from where you can also snorkel. We have Stand Up Paddleboards and Wave Kayaks for guests use too as well as flippers and masks for snorkeling.

If you are after a little more action you may ride behind our dinghy on water ski's, experience our wakeboard or skim across the waves at speed on our doughnut.




KAIRÓS: A 38 m long staysail schooner (Bermuda schooner), drawn by Klaus Röder from Tutzing, Germany. 2017 built of steel in the style of a classic yacht in Bodrum/Turkey. Finished in teak and mahogany, large open deck area, approx. 600 sm sail area, 8 double cabins in two categories, with en-suite bathroom and air-conditioning. The cabins on KAIRÓS are named after classic yachts.

Length over all: 38 m / max. 16 guests



CHRONOS: 54 m staysail ketch with wishbone. Drawn by Klaus Röder/Tutzing, Germany and built in 2013 in Bodrum/Turkey. Hull of steel, finished in teak and mahogany. Large free deck area, approx. 1,000 sm sails area, 13 double cabins with en-suite bathrooms and air-conditioning. The cabins on the CHRONOS are named after winds.

Length over all: 54 m / max. 26 guests



RHEA: Sister ship of the CHRONOS, built in 2017 in Bodrum/Turkey. The cabins on the RHEA are named after explorers.

Length over all: 54 m / max. 28 guests











SUSTAINABILITY.

Already now we set sails the majority of the time we are at sea, providing the winds are in our favour. When necessary, we will turn on the engines and we do have generators to support the main engine, the seawater desalination, cooking, washing, drying and cooling. Over the past few years we have solely been using AGO – automotive diesel which has a significantly lower sulphur content. To try and minimize our CO2 emissions – which are already lower than many other vessels – we aim to use synthetic diesel which ideally is produced by electricity generated from renewable sources.

We are also working on an innovative new concept so watch this space!

All three vessels are registered as commercial yachts and sail with professional crew. CHRONOS and RHEA under the Dutch flag, KAIRÓS under Maltese. They combine classic design and outstanding sailing performance with spacious cabins and comfort.

ATLANTIC:

To explore the infinite vastness of the ocean on a sailing yacht - the dream of so many sailors. In autumn we use the trade winds for the crossing from the Cape Verde Islands or the Canaries to the Caribbean. In spring the even more exciting route back to Europe. Up to 3,000 nautical miles non-stop. The guests are welcome to steer or join the watches.

Constant trade winds, water in all shades of blue and turquoise, small bays, tropical nature and wildlife, the Caribbean joie de vivre, reggae, volcanoes and sugar beaches - the Caribbean is just perfect for sailors ...




MEDITERRANEAN

Follow in the footsteps of the early seafarers and experience the most beautiful islands and coasts from the sea. A sailing holiday on board one of our yachts means relaxed sailing along spectacular stretches of coastline such as the Costa Smeralda in Sardinia, the Amalfi coast, off Sicily with the Lipari Islands or the Greek Cyclades.



Discover the Cape Verde Islands in 8- or 10-night cruises. Far off the coast of Africa in the Atlantic. Constant trade winds, still very warm even in November, steep volcanic islands with tropical vegetation, flat sand islands with desert character, a mix of Africa and Portuguese colonial history.



(1) THE LESSER ANTILLES: THE NORTH (Leeward Islands)

From Antigua, with the former English naval base "Nelson's Dockyard", today's hot spot for yachtsmen in the Caribbean, and the neighbouring island of Barbuda, with its secluded beaches and breeding area of the frigate birds, via St. Barth, the "St. Tropez of the Caribbean", and Saba, the sister islands of St. Kitts & Nevis, the volcanic island of Montserrat to Guadeloupe and via the Îles des Saintes back to Antigua. Sailing with the trade winds with plenty of time to discover even hidden secrets.

(2) THE LESSER ANTILLES: THE SOUTH (Windward Islands)

(3) THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC ...

Discover one of the islands of the Greater Antilles that has so much more to offer than all-inclusive resorts. High mountains up to more than 3000 m, from tropical vegetation with hundreds of palm trees to dry dunes and above all the oldest big city of America: Santo Domingo, whose unique old town is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In the north, we sail in the Bay of Samaná, where the humpback whales meet in spring and explore the unique Los Haitises National Park. We cruise along the eastern and southern coast with the national park of the island of Saona with its white beaches ...

The final highlight of our Caribbean season is the meeting of the most beautiful classic yachts off Antigua. CHRONOS and RHEA take actively part in the regatta. Mostly four days of regatta with different courses, beautiful ships and a colourful crowd of sailors from all over the world. Caribbean joie de vivre - a spectacular experience for real sailors, but also for those who 'just' admire the scenery!

Our sailing area, the Lesser Antilles from Grenada in the south to the British Virgin Islands (BVI) in the north is like a string of pearls, stretching across 600 nautical miles, approx. 1,000 km.

This is sailor's paradise, you know.

The diverse, mostly volcanic islands, the tropical climate, the flourishing nature and the constant north-easterly trade winds do offer sailing par excellence. Conditions you hardly find anywhere else.

Trade winds and waves. In the south the usual wind is east, that's why sailors prefer to sail in lee of the islands to the north or south. In the north the wind is more north east. Occasionally the trade wind can fresh up to appr. 8 bft. The regular 4 - 6 bft. are ideal for our vessels. It is usually calm in the shelter of the islands.

Above all the Caribbean is a **natural experience** on and under water. Turtles, dolphins, sometimes even whales. Frigate birds, terns and pelicans, hummingbirds and parrots. Endless beaches, snorkeling hotspots, green volcanic cones, waterfalls, historic forts and picturesque colonial architecture. Luxury resorts and local markets, Creole cuisine, reggae, rum...

Western Mediterranean



One of our favourite destinations. From the ancient cosmopolitan city of Syracuse via the Etna and Taormina through the Strait of Messina to the Lipari Islands: Lipari, Vulcano, Salina and Stromboli. A journey in the footsteps of Ulysses.

(2) SARDINIA / CORSICA 🗥

Discover one of the most beautiful and exclusive coasts of the Mediterranean from the sea. The Costa Smeralda, famous for its fine beaches, emerald green, crystal clear water and impressive granite rocks. The La Maddalena archipelago, the "Caribbean of the Mediterranean", the impressive entrance to the fjord-like harbour of Bonifacio in southern Corsica, the town on a 60 m high chalk plateau. In the summer we quite often spot some of the largest and most beautiful yachts in the world.

(3) AMALFI COAST AND GULF OF NAPLES ...

Amalfi, Capri, Ischia, Procida and Sorrento - a couple of the most legendary places of the Mediterranean, perfect to be explored from the sea. The beautiful coastline, the domes of the churches decorated with majolica tiles. With the yacht in front of the Faraglioni rocks off Capri. Ischia, Procida and the Bay of Pozzuoli. Just a dream with mostly light winds in summer.

Sailing into the Grand Harbour of Valletta on Malta on a yacht is just overwhelming. The small island of Comino with its famous Blue Lagoon, Gozo with it's long history and an anchorage in a collapsed cave ... A lot to discover in just one cruise.

(5) CÔTE D'AZUR AND BALEARIC ISLANDS 🥼

The fashionable Côte d'Azur with the highlight, the annual Les Voiles de St. Tropez, the most beautiful regatta of the Mediterranean. The bay of Hyères with the scenic Porquerolles. The natural harbour of Mahon on Menorca ... Yes, there are so many beautiful bays and places where we offer a wide variety of cruises.

The magic of the sea...

Appr. four to six hours of sailing a day, lunch in a bay, time for bathing, swimming and water sports, for shore excursions and relaxation, when the winds are favourite, move to another bay to spend the night at anchor - that's the concept of our Sailing Yacht Cruises.

We have a recommendation for the routing of the individual voyage. For each cruise the Captain will choose the best routing according to the actual wind and weather conditions. This is how yacht sailing works.













Eastern Mediterranean



(1) CROATIA / DALMATIAN ISLANDS ...

One of the most popular sailing areas with good winds, crystal clear water, a huge variety of islands, a rich history, small bays and pretty little harbour villages. Ideal for relaxed sailing, strolling in the bays and enjoying. nm: 150 / nights: 7

(2) CORFU / IONIAN ISLANDS 🧥

Discover an even more unknown part of Greece. The very green Corfu, in the north, not far from Albania, with a long Venetian history, Paxos and Antipaxos with turquoise green bays like in the Caribbean, Lefkas and Ithaca, the home of Odysseus. A sailing area with mostly light winds and less waves, so very suitable also for sailing beginners.

(3) CYCLADES ...

Snow-white cubic houses, churches with bright blue domes, pretty villages and small harbours, deep blue sea as far as the eye can see - the Aegean Sea is white, blue and light. There are one-week cruises in the southern Cyclades from/to Santorini via los, Amorgos, Paros and Folegandros. Sailing into the huge caldera of Santorini is more than impressive. In the northern Cyclades there are cruises from/to Piraeus close to Athens with Cape Sounion, Kythnos, Serifos, Hydra and Aegina.

(4) SARONIC GULF AND PELOPONNESE

We added the Saronic Gulf and the Peloponnese to our cruise plan, from/to Piraeus close to Athens and Nafplio south of Corinth. Here you are protected from the Meltemi, which can be strong in summer, and have a lot of choices for all weather conditions. A cruise can lead from Piraeus via Aegina, the excavations of Epidauros on the Peloponnese, Poros and Spetses to Nafplio. The other one-way trip from Nafplio with good winds to the south of the Peloponnese to Monemvasia and Pavlopetri and back via Hydra (in the footsteps of Leonard Cohen!), Aegina and possibly Salamis to Piraeus.
